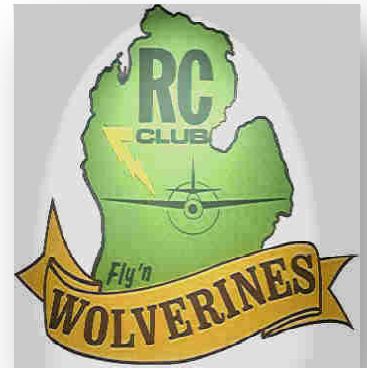


Meeting of the Fly'n' Wolverines

March 3, 2008, at the Macomb County Library

President Jerry LeLacheur called the meeting to order at 7:06 pm, and there were 13 members present.

Jerry read the Treasurer's report, as Glen was in the Virgin Islands, recruiting new members for our club, or maybe a mascot, we can't be sure from these pictures he brought back.



Our Treasurer and his new friend are getting along well, they are both grinning!

Jerry said that our treasury has \$2084.13, and our only expense last month was the AMA charter at \$90.

We have 21 paid members so far, so we are in good shape, as our rent is \$1000 for the year.

The Secretary read the minutes of the last meeting, which was just recently posted on the web site by the Webmaster. Many members were not able to connect to the website because of the strange name our website has,

The Secretary explained; it is because we have graciously been given the webspace by Bob Klena, a former member, who pays for this as part of his Comcast subscription. Bob has not been flying in quite a while, and in fact has sold all his RC equipment, so the subject of getting our own website was discussed, in the "New Business" section below.

Old Business:

Jerry and Dave Lockhart discussed the fence that was being donated by Dave's friend, "Cub". Dave volunteered to get it from Cub and bring it to the field, weather permitting. Dave said there may be excess fence, which is not of any use to Cub, and we will donate that to the Eagles Club, as they could use it.

New Business:

The website was further discussed, and the Secretary read a prepared explanation of the "World Wide Web", and the way a web site appears on the web. Some of the points from this discussion are:

- The Internet is basically a number of high-end computers networked together.
- Some of these computers are "hosts", leasing out space to others for display of a web page.
- You can connect by 'phone or cable to one of these hosts, if you subscribe to their service.
- You can also rent space on one of these "host" computers to display your information, written in a format called "html".
- You must have an address, so you must register your page name with one of the hosts that have been designated for this service.
- If you register a name, but don't lease "page space" the registrar will display your name only.
- Pricing of these service is about \$10 a year for registration, and \$6 to \$200 a month, depending on how much you want done for you on your web page.

If we register our name and rent "hosted space", our web page could have a more normal name, such as www.flynwolverines.com and this could be found more easily by people looking for our club.

A motion was made by Dave Lockhart to establish our own web page, and seconded by so many members that I couldn't record them. The membership voted, and the motion carried.

Jerry assigned Dave Bacon, your Secretary, to get together with Glen, and use the club's credit card to establish our account.

The Skymasters' Futaba Demo was brought up by Jerry, and more can be learned at their website, <http://www.skymasters.org/> about this April 23rd event at the Larson Middle School.
